He has also taught several undergraduate courses related to climate and clean energy, led development efforts, and managed teams that work at the intersection of science and action. Recently, he directed the Climate and Clean Energy Initiative at the Wisconsin Academy of Sciences, Arts and Letters. He was also Director of Outreach at the Wisconsin Energy Institute of UW–Madison, and was faculty in the Biology Department at Beloit College.
