Wisconsin Green Wave GOTV Campaign: Become a Relational Organizer!



With the election fast approaching, you may have seen the term "relational organizing" being used by everyone from grassroots organizations to presidential candidates (including 350 Madison). It is not a new term, in fact, it's used to describe something you do all the time: talking to people you know personally and persuading them to take an action. In this case, that action is voting.

We're much more likely to do something if we're convinced to do so by a friend or loved one than by a person we don't know at all. For this reason, we should all be relational organizers. Here at 350 Madison, we are encouraging and facilitating these personal conversations by providing training and an app to use to keep track of your progress.


Please join us for a short training to learn about our Relational Organizing Campaign. Training's are being offered on:

Rebuilding healthy ecosystems after environmental tragedies

In September, the nation watched as the West Coast went up in flames. As the nation reckons with rebuilding after these fires, one thing is certain: We'll need clean water and healthy



ecosystems. Chequamegon Bay has a long, rich history of gathering and growing food in ways that keep the water safe and healthy. Threatening that is Enbridge's plans to reroute their oil pipeline, Line 5, along the Bad River. Enbridge wants to put their pipeline to cross the Bad River just upstream next to Copper Falls, where oil spills will rage through the watershed much like how fire is tearing through the West. Rerouting Line 5 is just another way that a big corporation is trying to cut corners and get off easy. We know what we need to create healthy ecosystems: clean water, healthy food, and hard work that's respected and appreciated.
