- With as many different kinds of plants as possible.




- Co Benefits: Changing practices needs to make <u>business sense</u> for farmers.
 - Luckily, it can! With benefits for water, biodiversity, and human health too



CAFO: Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation


1,000+ "Animal Units" (1 animal unit = 1 cow for beef)



Greenhouse Gas Emissions from Agriculture




Greenhouse Gas Emissions from Agriculture




"Burping Cows"




CAFO liquid manure - additional impacts on water, air, human health, nutrient pollution.

Adding trees - silvopasture, alley cropping, multi-story farming, windbreaks



Changing practices

Improving Soil Health

- No-till
- Cover Cropping improve crop performance, reduce application of fertilizers
- Managed Grazing better animal health, reduces costs for farmers, fertilizes soil and manages weeds by mimicking natural processes.



Changing practices

Improving Ecosystem Health

- Greater diversity of crops.
- Vegetation to protect water riparian buffers, field borders
- Providing habitat.




