Let's rally together to strengthen our community and protect our beautiful planet!





Protecting Affordable Energy in Wisconsin: UPDATE!

Madison Gas & Electric (MGE) and Wisconsin Power & Light (WPL) have proposed rate increases for electricity and natural gas, as well as changes to the rules governing sales of excess energy back to the grid by rooftop solar users (i.e., net metering).

Since our last update, WPL has modified its Power Partnership proposal to preserve net metering for another two years, among other improvements. These changes are the result of pressure brought by intervenors (including 350 Wisconsin), our allies, and members of the public – a total of 1,247 comments/testimony in both cases to date!

Although WPL's current proposal is more favorable for distributed solar adoption, we strongly believe that the limited market penetration of 0.3% in our state does not warrant changes to net metering at this time. Rather than utility-by-utility decisions, a comprehensive, collaborative process is needed to arrive at a consistent statewide policy to address the future of net metering in Wisconsin.

Further, WPL's proposed rate hikes remain a threat. WPL proposes to increase electric rates by 8.4% in 2024 and a further 5.4% in 2025, while gas rates would be subject to a single increase of 6.3% in 2024. This will further exacerbate existing energy burdens experienced by WPL customers. We are delighted that Jay Brower, a member of CCST's Energy Equity Working Group and also the Community Advocates for Climate Resilience group (which focuses on the UW-Madison's West Campus District Plan), is a new Dane County Supervisor! He was appointed to fill the vacant Supervisor role for Dane County's District 13. This district encompasses much of the University of Wisconsin-Madison campus and the surrounding area and has a very large student population. Jay's commitment to reducing economic inequality in Wisconsin is evident from the fact that he left a faculty position out east to take a position here as a labor organizer with SEIU (Service Employees International Union) Wisconsin.



Electric School Buses Application Submitted for Madison Metropolitan School District

Since August, our Community Climate Solutions Team's Madison Community Working Group has been working with a Madison Metropolitan School District (MMSD) sustainability group to obtain the district's first set of electric school buses! Electric school buses reduce air pollution, noise, carbon emissions, school district operating costs, and harm to students' health. After a period of research and investigation, CCST helped First Student,

MMSD's new school bus provider, apply for electric school buses through the US Environmental Protection Agency's Clean School Bus program, funded by the Inflation Reduction Act. This MMSD 350 Wisconsin team has much more work ahead to ensure that MMSD reaches its goal of a 100% electric school bus fleet. Stay tuned!
