Climate Action Campaign DC Fly In

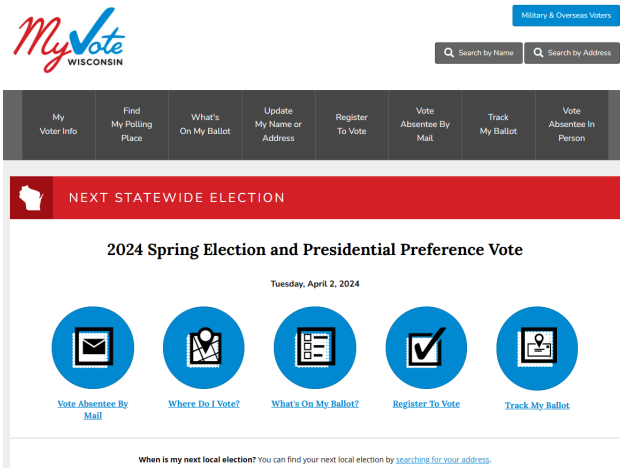
Earlier this month, Britnie Remer, 350 Wisconsin’s Fossil Fuel Organizer, and Emily Park, Co-Executive Director, traveled to Washington, D.C. for the [Climate Action Campaign](#) (CAC) onboarding fly-in!

During the visit, Britnie and Emily were able to connect with other members of CAC’s Wisconsin Table including Healthy Climate Wisconsin, Faith in Place, Moms Clean Air Force WI, and the WI chapter of National Wildlife Federation, as well as people from groups and organizations around the country.

The day one agenda was packed with interesting and engaging sessions that focused on what the work will look like as part of the CAC in 2024. Topics included the big picture and goals in the coming year, building power as a campaign, assessing access and influence, brainstorming and strategizing from a grassroots lens, and lobby prep.

On the second day everyone headed to the Hill! The WI Table secured meetings with Senator Baldwin and Representative Pocan, during which aspects of CAC’s [“Solutions for Pollution”](#) and [“Climate Wins Here”](#) campaigns were highlighted. Another main focus for CAC is to celebrate the climate action that the administration and state leaders have taken, and to [defend those achievements](#) from being rolled back.

Both Britnie and Emily are grateful for and excited about the opportunity to work together with other climate-focused organizations as part of CAC



Vote on February 20th!

The Spring Primary Election is already here, and voters across Wisconsin will head to the polls to narrow down candidates for local, nonpartisan positions such as school board members, county supervisors, and city alders. Your vote will have a HUGE impact in these local races, and candidates who advance from this election will face off in the Spring General Election on April 2nd!

Not all Wisconsin communities will have elections on February 20th – the best way to find out if you’ll be eligible to vote is by heading to the MyVote Wisconsin website.

If you’re eligible to vote on February 20th but need to register or update your registration:

- Register at your Municipal Clerk's Office by February 16th.
- Register at your polling place on February 20th before casting your vote.

Now is also a great time to check and update your voter registration online and make sure you're all set to vote in the first statewide election of 2024 in April!

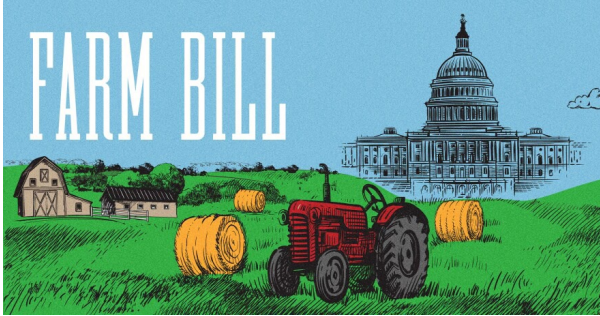
Help Shape Wisconsin's New Home Energy Rebate Program

Focus on Energy is holding stakeholder engagement sessions to share information on the state's [Home Energy Rebate Program](#) and to gather input that will shape program design. This feedback is critical for ensuring that programs are accessible, and that they center climate justice by targeting low income households and those with high energy burden. Program launch is expected in late 2024.

Wisconsin has been allocated \$149 million for Home Energy Rebates through the federal Inflation Reduction Act (IRA). Rebates will be provided through: 1) a home energy efficiency rebate program; and 2) an instant discount program for efficient electric appliances and home upgrades. These programs will help upgrade and modernize residential buildings across Wisconsin, reducing carbon emissions, providing home energy cost savings, and making homes healthier.

In addition to in-person sessions, there are two upcoming virtual sessions on February 8th and 26th, 6-7:30PM. Feedback can also be provided via [Online Survey](#) through February 29th.

The federal Farm Bill isn't just vitally important to farmers, it impacts every American community—urban, suburban and rural. This massive legislation shapes national policies dealing with everything from nutrition and hunger to climate change and natural resource conservation. Take Action: Residents of the Middleton-Cross Plains Area School District

MCPASD is planning to spend the majority of \$6M in money remaining from its 2018 tax referendum on three athletic facilities, including artificial turf on two new ballfields immediately adjacent to Pheasant Branch Creek. This artificial turf would: cost \$1.2M more than natural turf; need to be replaced every decade for another \$1.2M (compared to routine grass field maintenance); expose players and the creek's ecosystem to a wide variety of chemicals; add microplastics to the creek; and exacerbate runoff rates into the creek, which flooded massively in August 2018.

Join us in asking the MCPASD Board to *instead* spend this \$6M on climate mitigation initiatives that would (1) reduce District energy bills and GHG emissions, thereby helping MCPASD reach its climate emissions goals and shift to 100% renewable energy by 2035, and (2) qualify MCPASD to receive up to \$1.8M in Inflation Reduction Act money and likely even more from other climate programs.

1.2 Gigawatt Solar Project Under Development in Wisconsin

Planning has started for a new and transformational solar development near the towns of Plover and Grant in Portage County, WI. Vista Sands Solar Farm will be nearly 1.2 gigawatt (GW) in size and utilize about 8,500 acres of private land. This is a massive project compared to others 350 Wisconsin has supported in the last several years. In addition to the long-term benefits of providing fossil-free renewable energy to thousands of Wisconsin homeowners, it has the potential to transform the area with new jobs and added tax revenues. The project will bring a total capital investment over \$1 billion and create approximately 500 jobs during construction and about 50 permanent jobs, helping stimulate economic activity that benefits everyone.

The State Policy Team will be tracking this project as it moves through the application and approval process. There will be opportunities for 350 Wisconsin members to provide input to support the project and make your voice heard that it's time for Wisconsin to take a lead in renewable energy development.

Those Who Help Beaver are Doing an Amazing Job!

On Jan. 30 a webinar was presented by Waadookawaad Amikwag ("Those Who Help Beaver" in the Anishinaabe language), which showed the shocking truth about the long-lasting ecological damage that Enbridge created as it pushed through Minnesota in 2021. Although W.A. is reporting on Line 3 (the tar sands oil pipeline now known as Line 93), their findings are of supreme importance to those of us fighting Enbridge Line 5 or any petroleum pipeline.

Their recently published website at www.WaadookawaadAmikwag.org contains a wealth of devastating facts, photos and videos, showing that Enbridge cannot be trusted to protect the land and water where they install pipelines. The evidence that these scientists, drone operators, and trained laypeople have exposed can be a warning to Wisconsinites who treasure clean water.

The six types of construction damage described and pictured on the website are aquifer breaches, frac-outs, wetland destruction, threats to Manoomin (wild rice), "remediation" damages, and dewatering and aquifer drawdown. W.A. has made its evidence known to Minnesota agencies, but the state has not responded by protecting or restoring the environment.

MMSD Student Activists Save Renewable Energy Goals, Achieve Concrete Wins

Aharon Shelef, a 350 WI intern, helped mobilize students from Madison Metropolitan School District's (MMSD's) West, Memorial, and La Follette High Schools to attend the MMSD Board of Education Operations Work Group's January 22nd meeting. Seven of these students presented [public comments](#), demanding that the Board prioritize sustainability in district facilities and achieve MMSD's renewable energy goals. They also presented their 01/21/2024 Capitol Times [letter to the editor](#) that over 800 MMSD high school students signed, further demonstrating that sustainability is a top priority for students.

Moreover, upon learning a couple of days ahead of time that the meeting agenda included a proposal to weaken the renewable energy goals, the students (in their words) "condemned even entertaining this dangerous, time-wasting proposal of arguing about existing goals instead of focusing on how to achieve them." When the issue of making "adjustments" to the renewable energy goals came up, the presenter explained that, "based on the [students'] comments," the Board would not discuss altering their ambitions, thus preserving the goals.

In sum, these students' strong showing of support and concrete proposals for next steps put sustainability at the top of the Board's list

of priorities to consider when addressing long-range facilities planning, the upcoming budget process, and a potential referendum this year.
