

Building GHG Emissions by State








Gas combustion emissions Oil emissions Propane emissions



Energy Source Used for Home Heating (2017)










• Energy burden/affordability


• Increasing gas system costs

- Vulnerable communities, low-income customers risk being stranded on a gas system with increasing costs
- Prioritize them for electrification programs, lead decision-making

Indoor air quality

- Eliminating the emissions from burning fossil fuels inside homes provides major public health benefits.


